What does a Friends Group do?

Friends groups undertake a variety of activities. These can include work days at the park to help with a project, organizing fund raisers to help purchase much needed equipment or supplies, or serving as an advocate for the park when needed.

Friends groups are essential partners in protecting and enhancing DCR's parks.

More than 70 groups are working across the state to enhance our forests and parks system, including:

Fundraising

- Operate a gift shop at Borderland State Park
- Pancake Breakfasts at Scusset Beach
- Scusset Beach stickers, buttons, and key chains available at the Scusset Beach office.

Projects

- Scusset Beach Boardwalk to the Canal Access Road.
- Scusset Beach pathway in the campground.
- 2012 – Our Friends group is still forming project plans for 2012, clean up and beautification of the beach bathhouse area, with advisement from John DeCosta, Scusset Beach Park Supervisor.

Other Activities

- Regular meetings at Scusset Beach throughout the camping season to formulate plans and organize and follow through on fundraising, projects and grants.

- Design and maintain friend's group website for Scusset Beach friends
- Participation in Park Serve Day – spring planting and preparing the park for the summer camping season.

Given the fiscal climate and the current economy, now is the perfect time for a Friends group to aid in making improvements to Scusset Beach possible. The Friends Group can help us leverage funds from the Department of Conservation and Recreation's Matching Partnership grants to improve the park, as well as assisting with projects and fund raising.

Other people are content to pay their membership dues knowing that they will support the park. Your level of involvement is up to each individual member.

A Few Words from John....

Once again autumn is upon us and, as I write this column, we have had our first weekend of off-season camping with over 50 sites taken for the weekend. It is hard to imagine where the summer went. This season went down as the second busiest season on record (last season being the first) and heavily taxed the staff and the facility.

However, there was also lots of good news. In June, the Department hired a contractor to clear the power easement, solving one of the main issues with the electrical system. The upgrades to the campground comfort station were well received by our campers, and I cannot even count the good comments on the new campground pathway the Friends installed.

I seldom like to single out people because we all contribute what we can, but I have to mention Paul Loiselle for all his hard work on the pathway. From writing the grant, to helping with the design, to construction day and beyond to finish up the small items, Paul dedicated a great deal of time to this project. His recognition by the Friends statewide network as a Volunteer of the Year is well deserved.

Speaking of the Friends network, I was pleasantly surprised at my own award and thank you all very much for voting for me. One of the first things I recognized when I came to Scusset was how many people simply love this place and wanted to help. It took a couple of seasons to get the Friends group idea to gel, and I am so proud of all we have accomplished together.

Looking ahead to this winter, there are two items that I would like to mention. The first is that over the winter, Dave and I, with some regional help, will be moving the park office to the Fish Pier building. This much needed move will allow for better parking, a more efficient operation, and actually give the staff running water and restrooms where they work. I am very excited about this move.

The second item is that the DCR recently bid out a study of the electrical system. An engineering company is being hired to examine the entire system from A to Z to determine all its needs. While this is a small step along the way to upgrading the electric, it is an important first step and gives us something to build on.


